Virtual Limited Conservatorship Workshop



Do you need a court order that lets you make decisions for a developmentally disabled adult?

Conservator: Helps a person with a developmental disability (the conservatee) to maintain maximum self reliance and independence in specific ways described in a court order.

Conservatee: A person who is unable to provide for their own personal or financial needs.

Limited Conservatorships help the conservator to:

- Make medical decisions and access records of the conservatee;
- Determine where the conservatee will live;
- Access confidential records of conservatee;
- Control the conservatee's ability to enter/sign contracts with others;
- Possibly make other decisions for the conservatee about educational, social, and job issues.
