Court Honors Winners of Law Day Art Contest with Showcase and Prizes

Court awarded first, second and third place winners in poster contest held for participants at The James Ranch and Juvenile Hall.

SAN JOSE, Calif. (May 13, 2013): in celebration of National Law Day, the Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara (Court) sponsored an art competition for youth in the Juvenile Justice System and who are residing at The James Ranch and Juvenile Hall. All art submission will be on display through the month of May at the Court's Hall of Justice.

In 1961, by joint resolution, Congress designated May 1 as the official date for celebrating Law Day. Law Day programs are designed to help people understand how law keeps us free and how our legal system strives to achieve justice. This year's art contest theme, "Realizing the Dream: Equality for All" was chosen by the American Bar Association.

"Beyond the artistic achievements, the incredibly positive messages and thoughtful designs from these young people is truly inspiring," said Judge Julia Alloggiamento, Chair of the Court's Community Outreach and Planning Committee. "They're obviously going through a rough period in their development; providing a meaningful experience that helps them reflect on their choices, where they want to take their lives and the values of our society as a whole is tremendously beneficial for them. We are very grateful for our justice partners coming together to help make this experience happen."

A delegation of judges and public officials, including Judge Julia Alloggiamento, Judge Maureen Folan, Judge Jesus Valencia, Public Defender Molly O'Neal and the District Attorney's Community Prosecutor Johnny Gogo hosted receptions at both The James Ranch and Juvenile Hall to honor participants, announce the winners and discuss the posters. Santa Clara County, Department of Probation supplied ice cream and cookies for the participating youth.

The Court awarded first, second and third place winners at both the James Ranch and Juvenile Hall, with the first place winners receiving a gift card to Michaels, second place winners receiving movie tickets and third place winners receiving gift certificates to Jamba Juice. All winners also received a replica copy of the Constitution or Declaration of Independence. All participants received a 2G storage drive as well as a certificate for participation. Prizes and art supplies were supplied from donations from the Court's judges, as well as the Santa Clara County Bar Association.


