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#### Opportunities for Engagement at School





**Student Advisory Committee** 16 student who are elected (2 from each middle school and K-8 site). They must be in good standing at their school site. Three officers are elected by the committee - Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, and Clerk. The SAC is facilitated by a designated District liaison



<u>California Student Mock Election</u> helps young people discover the importance of elections and the power of their vote in our democracy. It gives high school and middle school students firsthand experience with the electoral process by giving them a chance to make their voices heard on the candidates and issues important to them and their families.



National Voter Registration Day High schools can promote pre-registration. Schools can now include younger students in voter registration drives and generate greater participation and engagement on campus. You can contact the Secretary of State's Office Voter to order pre-registration flyers.
