What is Peer Court

 Peer Court is an early intervention, prevention, and diversion program run by teen, for teens. Youth offenders charged with first-time misdemeanors, or students charged with certain California Ed Code violations may be referred to Peer Court.





PEER COURT

Peer Court is a youth-driven approach to restorative, rather than punitive, juvenile justice. We work to build positive, transformational relationships, empathy, and community problem-solving skills with county youth.

How our process works

Victimless Violatations -Restorative Model



Through motivational interviewing and trauma-informed questioning, we portray a holistic view of the respondent, focusing both on the respondent's strengths and interests and how to move forward from the violation

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Violations with Victims -Youth Court



Through a two-party system that utilizes a jury of 12 youth, the Youth and Community Advocates work together to address the violation, how the respondent can work towards repairing the harm done to the victim, while providing the jury with a holistic view of the respondent,

We are a youth-led organization offering other youth an opportunity to avoid suspension and expulsion while staying out of the juvenile justice system.

Interventions:

Peer Court encourages students to be creative with interventions, and to tailor interventions to best assist a referred student to make better choices in the future. Equally, interventions are an integral component in ensuring justice has occurred for the victim as well.

Students should consider existing interventions within the program that are available and practice developing interventions that fit the wrongdoing. Additionally, students should match referred student offenses, background information, case information and circumstances of the choice made to meaningful interventions to promote restorative justice.

School administrators will always be consulted prior to court to provide input regarding school capacity to support interventions.

 - Humanizes the referred student
- Restorative Interventions look at student's strengths
