REPORTS

Chair's Report: Chair BurtonBurke reported on the following:

- JJC is working on 3 different reports (scattered sites, Secure Youth facility, Juvenile Hall).
- JJC met with Probation Department's data team.
- Race Equity Through Prevention and Race Equity in the Justice System are back up and running.
- Looking for a venue to accommodate hybrid meetings.

Presiding Judge: Honorable Maureen Folan reported on the following:

- Very busy in Juvenile Justice.
- Kudos for Secure Track programming.

Dependency Court: No one present to report.

Alternate Defender's Office: David Epps had nothing new to report.

Independent Defense Office: Lana Kreidie had nothing new to report.

Legal Advocates for Children & Youth (LACY): Andrew Cain had nothing new to report.

Dependency Advocacy Center (DAC): Preeti Mishra reported on the following:

- Office will be presenting at a national conference that is focused on interdisciplinary parent representation.
- Monday, June 5th is Family Reunification Day!

The Office of Mediation and Ombuds Services: Ruth Maurice had nothing new to report.

Alternative Schools Department: Mark Camilleri reported on the following:

- Court schools open year round, so during summer students have the opportunity to take all
 educational classes.
- Focused on science enrichment through project-based learning this summer.
- Offering summer swim class.
- Grateful for relationship with Probation at Blue Ridge.

Eugene Santillan reported on the following:

- Growing/gardening this summer.
- Partnering with librarians to promote literacy and provide more opportunities for credit recovery.
- Juvenile Justice Gender Responsive Mapping meeting took place on 4/28.
- Commissioner Sirkay added: Blue Ridge is being honored at the Hoffman Awards dinner on 5/10.

Department of Children and Family Service (DFCS): Damion Wright reported on the following:

- Daniel Little was promoted to SSA Director.
- Working on several plans to be submitted to the state this year.
- Working on data for JJC.

Probation Department:

Trina Gauthier reported on the following for Juvenile Hall:

- SYTF boys and girls celebrated Easter by decorating eggs & hunting for them.
- Supervising Group Counselors at Juvenile Hall planned and funded a Group Counselor Appreciation Day.
- SYTF young adult in A1 selected to be the recipient of the JCCASAC scholarship.

Elsa Jennings reported on the following for the Ranch:

- Current population: 14 at the Ranch, 1 at Juvenile Hall, 8 in aftercare program.
- Actively working on least restrictive programming options.
 - o Judge Folan asked: When will it be greenlighted?
 - Elsa: There is no definite date yet.
- Had a tour with SCCOE board members and state senator Dave Cortese.

Ignacio Carriles reported on the following for services:

- JPD supervision officers were successfully entered into the County Communications dispatch system (4 radios made available to them for use for field safety).
- Several staff completed court training program and returned to their assignments.
- JPD and APD collaborated with SCCSET to conduct court ordered search safely and effectively.
- Several staff participated in Career Day at Dolores Huerta Middle School.
- Collaborative presentation with SJPD to youth who were cited for attendance at side shows.

• Board of State and Community Corrections approved recommendation to award SCC Probation Department funding to move forward with a mobile probation service center.

Behavioral Health: Grace Gonzalez reported on the following:

- Staff continue to provide support to youth at Juvenile Hall, the Ranch, and Secure Track.
- Staff are participating in warm hand offs for youth from DJJ.

Mayra Vargas reported on the following:

- Onboarding staff for Juvenile Hall and the Ranch treatment teams.
- Onboarding clinician to be stationed in Morgan Hill.

Medical Services: Dr. Shelley Aggarwal reported on the following:

- Juvenile Health Custody services received a referral from the Board of Supervisors regarding blood lead screenings of youth in the facilities.
- Started a peer health education curriculum at the Ranch last fall that was very successful, so it's now being implemented as a recurring intervention (2-3 times per year).
- JCH received a grant related to MAT and opioid use disorders.
- May 6-12th is National Nurses Week.
- Judge Folan asked about the Covid situation at the Ranch and Juvenile Hall?
 - o Dr. Aggarwal: There are no current Covid positive youth.

Law Enforcement Agencies: Captain Jason Dwyer reported on the following:

Patrol division continues to implement a class called "Why You Stopped Me."

District Attorney's Office: Stacey Capps had nothing new to report.

Public Defender's Office: Nisreen Baroudi reported on the following:

- Gone live as of 5/1 to make sure there is compliance with AB740.
- There is a new hotline for youth to call to speak with a community outreach attorney.
 - o Only possible due to recent expansion of community outreach team.
- Meeting with DJJ director to determine which youth are left to return.
- Regarding Secure Track girls PDO is meeting with CEO and BH, as well as the girls.
- DFCS agreed to meet with PDO regularly.
- PDO is concerned about the Camp being used as a residential facility will be discussed at the next advisory committee meeting.
