AMENDED ORDER

The Santa Clara County Juvenile Court judicially notices that the Santa Clara County Probation Department and the Santa Clara County Department of Family and Children's Services are required to investigate, notify and make recommendation to the Court regarding education issues concerning minors who are subject to proceedings instituted by these departments and by the Santa Clara County District Attorneys Office.

The court judicially notices that the school-age minors who are the subject of these investigations are students within one of the various Santa Clara County School Districts and the County Office of Education.

Pursuant to Education Code Section 49076 any county placing agency for the purpose of fulfilling educational case management responsibilities required by the juvenile court and to assist with the school transfer or enrollment of a pupil is authorized access to student records. Education Code 49061(f) defines a county placing agency as the county social service department or the county probation department.

Education Code Section 49077 provides that information concerning a student shall be furnished in compliance with a court order.

In order to complete their statutorily mandated investigations and make proper recommendations to the Court, it is necessary that these departments have access to school information regarding these minors.

THEREFORE, pursuant to the above cited authority, the authority to enforce, interpret and administer juvenile court law, the duty to enforce the delivery of services to at risk minors, the duty to develop permanent programs of interagency development, and the duty to maintain close liaison with school authorities and encourage coordination of policies and programs,

IT IS ORDERED: the Standing Order of March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2000 issued by Judge Thomas Edwards is hereby extended until further order of the Court. The school officials of the Santa Clara County Office of Education and each of the Santa Clara County School districts shall release to probation officers of the Santa Clara County Probation Department and social workers of the Santa Clara County Department of Family and Children's Services information relating to any minor under investigation who may have attended or is attending a school within a particular district or associated with with Santa Clara County Office of Education.

Any such information received by these agencies shall be used exclusively for the investigative and reporting duties of the department personnel.
