## STANDING ORDER

AUTHORIZING DISCLOSURE OF REDACTED INFORMATION FROM
POPULATION CHARTS, DISCIPLINE LOGS, AND ADMINISTRATION LOGS AS
WELL AS ADMINISTRATION OF SHORT OPINION SURVEYS TO STAFF AND
PARTICIPANTS FOR RESEARCH CONDUCTED BY SAN JOSÉ STATE UNIVERSITY
ABOUT THE IMPACT OF THE ART OF YOGA PROJECT

The Court finds that it will be beneficial to the youth served by the County of Santa Clara, Probation Department – Juvenile (the "Unit"), for both youth and staff to participate in the research study entitled "Evaluation of The Art of Yoga Project (AYP)" (the "Project"). The Project will be conducted by a team led by Dr. Danielle Harris and Dr. Edith Kinney of San José State University (SJSU) (collectively, "Researchers"). The first phase of the Project involves examining the type and frequency of disciplinary reports made on the Unit on days with and without yoga class as well as before and after yoga class. In the second phase of the study, Researchers will administer short staff surveys that measure the staff's opinions, perspectives, and experiences of the AYP. This Project will augment the ongoing collection of "quarterly program feedback questionnaires" and "adolescent mood inventories" that are already administered to girls participating in the AYP.

## Court hereby Orders as follows:

 Researchers are authorized to conduct the Project in accordance with the ethical guidelines of the SJSU Institutional Review Board.

- Researchers are authorized to review information from redacted population charts,
  discipline logs, and administration logs collected during a period of approximately two
  months (specific dates to be determined by agreement of Unit staff and Researchers),
  and Unit staff are authorized to release such information to Researchers;
- 3. Researchers are authorized to administer a short anonymous survey to Unit staff at the end of their shifts, for a period of two months during a two-month period prior to expiration of this Order;
- 4. Researchers are authorized to administer a short anonymous survey to AYP participants on a monthly basis;
- Researchers shall be bound by the confidentiality provisions of the Welfare and Institutions Code §§ 827;
- 6. Researchers are ordered to use any confidential information solely for purposes of the Project;
- 7. AYP participants shall be adequately protected from risk by SJSU, including but not limited to, injury, bodily harm, psychological trauma or release of potentially damaging information, and no identifying information will be collected or reported;
- 8. This order supersedes any other conflicting order;

9. A copy of this order shall be placed in the file of each juvenile participant.
