Standing Order Regarding Data Sharing Agreement between Fresh Lifelin

& the Santa Clara County Probation Department

Fresh Lifelines for Youth (FLY) provides a broad range of programs and services to Santa Clara County (SCC) youth on probation in an effort to reduce crime and incarceration. In an effort to measure outcomes and impact, we are in the process of evaluating our programs and services. Data collected by the SCC Probation Department could significantly support our evaluative efforts and ultimately help us continue to provide outstanding programs and services aimed at reducing crime and incarceration. For this reason, FLY would like to enter into a data sharing agreement with the SCC Probation Department.

Specifically, this agreement would include the sharing of non-privileged juvenile court records on those youth who (1) participated in FLY's programs during and between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2020 and (2) were referred to the County of Santa Clara County Probation Department during this same time period. July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2020. The information to be provided includes but is not limited to risk level, adjudicated offenses and offense dates, and violations of probation.

Additionally, Aggregate information provided on youth who did not participate in FLY's programs will be pulled one time from July 1, 2014 and then again one time yearly for the remainder of this agreement. Any other aggregate information provided on youth who did not participate in FLY's programs will be evaluated on a case by case basis and will be subject to Probation's agreement.
