STANDING ORDER REGARDING THE EXCHANGE OF DATA BETWEEN DEPENDENCY ADVOCACY CENTER AND THE SANTA CLARA COUNTY PROBATION DEPARTMENT TO DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY FOR DAC'S CORRIDOR PROGRAM

Dependency Advocacy Center ("DAC") is working collaboratively with the Santa Clara County Probation Department ("Probation") to break the cycle of system involvement for formal probationers who are parenting or expecting new children. This Corridor Program collaboration provides the enhanced support of a multidisciplinary attorney, social worker, mentor parent team to families where at least one parent is on formal probation. To ensure that all eligible cases are assigned to the Corridor Program team at the earliest possible point, it is necessary to share with Probation the names and dates of birth for parents identified in Detention/Initial Hearing reports. This information will be solely used to enable Probation to confirm that one or more of the parents identified is on formal probation and, thus, eligible for Corridor Program services.

Finding good cause for the exchange of this information for the purpose described herein,

IT IS THERFORE ORDERED,

- 1. DAC is authorized to provide to Probation the following data for those parents identified in Detention/Initial Hearing reports: Name and date of birth. This data will be used exclusively to confirm the parent(s) formal probation status and determine eligibility for DAC's Corridor Program.
- 2. This order expires on December 31, 2018.
