## ORDER EXTENDING BAIL SCHEDULE

GOOD CAUSE APPEARING, the Court orders application of the below Bail Schedule. This schedule shall be applied to all accused persons arrested and in pretrial custody, and to all accused persons held in pretrial custody. This schedule was to be effective until January 31, 2022, and it is hereby extended and will remain in effect until **February 28, 2022** unless amended or repealed by the Court.

## SANTA CLARA COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT BAIL SCHEDULE

Scheduled bail for all misdemeanor and felony offenses is set at \$0, with the exception of only the offenses listed below:

- 1. A serious felony, as defined in Penal Code section 1192.7(c), or a violent felony, as defined in Penal Code section 667.5(c);
- 2. A felony violation of Penal Code section 69;
- 3. A violation of Penal Code section 166(c)(1);
- 4. A violation of Penal Code section 136.1, when punishment is imposed under section 136.1(c);
- 5. A violation of Penal Code section 262;

1	6. A violation of Penal Code sections 243(e)(1) or 273.5;
2	7. A violation of Penal Code section 273.6 if the detained person made threats to kill or
3	harm, has engaged in violence against, or has gone to the residence or workplace of, the
4	protected party;

36. Any person who, at the time of arrest, was out of custody on pretrial release (including own recognizance, supervised own recognizance, or monetary bail of \$0 or more) on one or more felony cases, or two or more misdemeanor cases.

Scheduled bail for all violations of misdemeanor probation, whether the arrest is with or without a bench warrant, is \$0. Scheduled bail for violations of felony probation, parole, post-release community supervision, or mandatory supervision, is \$0, except for charges of conviction listed in exceptions (1) through (36). For violations of probation, parole, post-release community supervision, or mandatory supervision, where the underlying crime of conviction is listed in exceptions (1) through (36), scheduled bail is the bail amount listed in the court's 2021 local county bail schedule.

The 2021 Santa Clara County Bail Schedule, including the June 2021 Amendment authorizing cite and release for various arrestees, will remain in effect for all offenses listed in (1) through (36) above, including any count-specific conduct enhancements and any status enhancements.

The court retains discretion to deny bail as authorized by article I, section 12, or 28(f)(3) of the California Constitution, to set a higher bail for any offense, including those with a bail of \$0, and/or to order conditions of release deemed appropriate for any offense. Setting of bail is at the discretion of the judicial officer reviewing the case with due consideration of public safety and health concerns.
