

Name and/or Gender Change (Minor)

Step 2	Copies: Make 2 copies of the forms, in addition to the original.
Step 3 There is a filing fee, unless the fee is waived. You must bring: ☒ Completed forms from Step 1 (originals and all copies) ☒ Self-addressed stamped envelope ☒ A check for the filing fee and each certified copy of the decree that you want (there is a fee for each certified copy) Note: If you cannot afford the fees, fill out the fee waiver forms FW-001 and FW-003 You will be given a court date about 8 weeks out. ☐ If you <u>are not</u> asking for a fee waiver, you will pay the filing fee and get copies back with a file-stamp. ☐ If you <u>are</u> asking for a fee waiver, there is a 24 to 48 hour hold on the papers. During that time, the Judge will determine if the filing fee will be waived. The clerk will tell you when to come back to pick up your forms.
Step 4 Skip to step 5, if both parents are requesting this change.	Service on the Other Parent: If you are filing without the other parent: ☐ If they live in California, have an adult, <i>not you</i>, hand-deliver a filed copy of the Petition (NC-500) and the Order to Show Cause (NC-520) to the other parent(s) at least 30 days before your hearing date or 30 days from the date the court issued NC-520, use whichever date occurred earlier. ☐ If they do not live in California, have an adult, <i>not you</i>, mail a filed copy of the Petition (NC-500) and the Order to Show Cause (NC-520) to the other parent(s) at least 35 days before your hearing date or 35 days from the date the court issued NC-520, use whichever date occurred earlier. ☐ If you do not know where the other parent(s) lives or how to find them, then you need to fill out and file a Request to Dispense with Notice of the other parent(s). Whoever delivers ("serves") the forms must complete the Proof of Service form (NC-121). This must be filed with the Clerk's at least 5 days before the scheduled court date.
Step 5	What happens next: No objection is filed: You will not need to attend your hearing date. If any additional steps are required, the Clerk's Office will contact you. Make sure the court record is updated with your current phone number.

Objection is filed: You should attend your Court hearing. At the hearing, the Judge may sign the <i>Order Recognizing Minor's Change of Gender and Sex Identifier and for Issuance of New Birth Certificate and Decree Changing Name (form NC-530)</i>. After the hearing, take your signed Order to the Probate Clerk's Office (room 107) for filing. You may purchase certified copies of your signed decree for additional cost.

WHAT DO I DO AFTER I GET THE MINOR'S NAME AND GENDER CHANGE DECREE?

You may want to amend their birth record with their new name and gender. If they were born in California, contact the Office of Vital Records. You can get more information at <http://www.cdph.ca.gov>. If they weren't born in California, check with the Office of Vital Records in the state where they were born.
