The Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara, is proud to announce that Mr. Steve Baron, Director of Family Court Services, is the recipient of an award from the Santa Clara County Psychological Association for "Outstanding Contribution by a Mental Health Professional." He received the award in gratitude for the training that Family Court Services has coordinated and provided the membership in the area of Domestic Violence. Mr. Baron accepted the award at an annual dinner of the Association on February 28, 2004. In addition to Mr. Baron, Judges Dolores Carr, Mary Ann Grilli, and Richard Loftus, Jr., as well as Lilly Grenz and Janeen Carlo of Family Court Services Division have been instrumental in providing this training.
